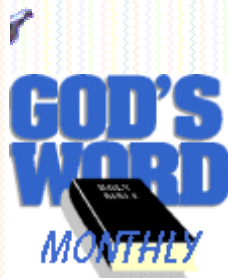

"YOU SHALL BE HOLY FOR I, THE LORD YOUR GOD AM HOLY"

God's holiness is being set apart from evil and He expects His people to be separated from evil also. To be holy is to be set apart from selfishness to display appropriate behaviour towards God and others. His purpose for His people is to reflect His nature, attitudes and characteristics in their actions. God continually demonstrated His care for the aged, the homeless, the fatherless, the oppressed and the stranger.

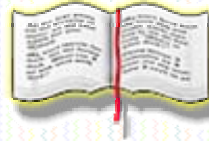
Holiness begins in the heart, spreading in the family and community. Honouring parents, elders and provisions given to the poor is anticipated. The handicapped people are to receive the right treatment, foreigners and strangers are to be treated correctly. Proper sexual relationships are expected, respect towards elders, including not seeking revenge. Verbal profanity is contradictory to a lifestyle of holiness. Obedience to God is the proper answer and reply, whether in words or in action, to God's Gift of Grace.

Believer's become sanctified before God because of what Jesus Christ has achieved for them. God's Laws are the basis for conduct referring to a personal covenantal relationship, they reveal the level of commitment to God by the quality of behaviour. Holy conduct was taught by Jesus. OF LEVITICUS

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-  **BIBLICAL KNOWLEDGE**- Did you know that Ezra the priest and scribe is ranked second only to Moses as God's lawgiver and prophet? He is considered by many as the second founder of the Jewish Nation. Not only did Ezra help reinstate the Law and apply The Temple worship order after the Babylonian exile, he required that all the Jewish men now living back in their own land who had married apart from their own race to leave their foreign wives and children. Because they had wed with the neighbouring peoples they had joined with their detestable worship practices of false gods and idols, one of the reasons for exile from God, seventy years prior.

A JUNE EVENT -England's John Wycliffe embodied Protestantism long before Luther, and the **Reformation began to break out in England 130 years before it began in Germany**. However it was aborted. England was an unhealthy place. Few reached age 40. There was little public sanitation, and the stench of latrines, tanneries, and livestock sullied the air. The plague struck with frightening regularity—The population grew angry and social order deteriorated. A poll tax in 1380 sparked violence, and many felt Wycliffe reforming messages had contributed to the uprising. The reformer, quoted by rebel leaders, tried to distance himself from the revolt. On June 10, 1381 mobs swarmed through Canterbury, sacking the palace of Archbishop Sudbury. On June 11 revolutionaries rolled like a flood toward London, believing in the reign of Christian democracy. King Richard II hid in the Tower of London as the horde stormed the capital. The next morning he agreed to meet with the insurgents in North London. Rebel leaders, unsatisfied with his answers, rushed back to the tower, seized Archbishop Sudbury while he was singing Mass in the chapel, forced his neck on a log, and hacked off his head. They began to murder at will. The shaken king retired to his mother's quarters near St. Paul's Cathedral. The next morning, June 15, 1381, Richard took the sacrament and rode out to face the rebels. When combat broke out, he rode bravely toward the masses and dared them to kill their king. The rebels hesitated, and the people sided with Richard. The tide had turned. The revolt was crushed; and the Reformation was deferred until another day. King Richard II, incredibly, was only 14 years old.
